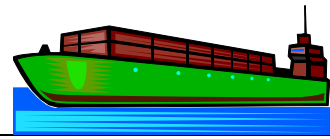


Busy Harbours!



Draw a compound bar graph using the data in Figure 13.9 on page 136 of *Geography Now*.

A compound bar graph is where two or more sets of data are drawn within the same bar, one on top of the other (see the sample graph at right). In our activity, draw the Domestic Cargo bars for each of the areas first, then add the International Cargo bars *on top of* the Domestic Cargo bars. Devise a scale and a legend that clearly indicates what the bars represent, label both axis, and add an appropriate title.
